


ACT@Scale

About the project

ACT@Scale taps into experiences from successful real life deployment projects in 5 European regions and moves beyond condition specific areas by focusing on how innovative healthcare solutions are scaled up successfully on an organisational level.

By using indicators to assess real world services and linking drivers and outcomes, ACT@Scale will provide guidance on changing care service delivery in European regions and beyond.



Goals & methods

Identify, transfer and scale up existing and operational Care Coordination and Telehealth good practices with the target of reaching a total of 75,000 care recipients across regions and programmes in multiple European countries.



ACT@Scale activities are built around key methods and aspects needed in order to reach the project goal.

Achievements


The project has presented the following outputs

- Maps of maturity** in the different areas of the programs, using an agreed structured and visual representation. These maps have already been presented to the EIP AHA B3 group for other regions to represent their integrated care structure (Webinar May 2017) and in collaboration with other EU projects.
- Evaluation Framework and minimum dataset**, condensing the data collection approach and dependencies. This framework has been presented in several EU forums and in discussions with several international projects (ICIC 2017)
- PDSA Methodology** with a first collaborative cycle completed. The methodology and first lessons learned was the key topic of the transferability event organised by ACT@Scale in collaboration with the WHINN2017 event in Odense (Oct 2017).
